# **Executive Summary - Groups/Topics**

# FOOD SECURITY

**The Youth Food Hackathon** - a school-based initiative that aims to promote behavior change amongst youth by youth. The Food Security team developed their idea by identifying the next steps for their initiative. Various partners and ideas were highlighted.

### NATIONAL TALENT

The leadership program for Nationalisation in International Private Sector companies. The team focused on identifying their key activities which included funding, project management, final MVP definition, and target companies readiness.

### HEALTHCARE

The Healthcare Experiment to Accelerate Technology Adoption in Healthcare System of the UAE. They identified the key milestones that need to be taken which encompassed defining the scope and stakeholders, establishing regulatory restraints to solutions, signing MoE, meeting UAE Reglab to obtain parameters.

### SUSTAINABILITY

Promoting impact-based investment for Sustainability, the team identified the challenges, solutions, and the endgame of their outcome-based investing as well as facilitating impact investment.

# SHINE

In alignment with Saudi Vision 2030 and the UAE government's commitment to Nationalisation, the collaboration between the HBS Club of GCC, Alfaisal University (KSA), and Citizen School (UAE) introduces an innovative program. Geared towards nurturing the entrepreneurial acumen of high school students, this initiative offers a unique opportunity for participants to gain hands-on industry exposure through work placements and vocational training. Eligibility extends to KSA students in Grade 11, 12, and early EE graduates, as well as UAE students in Grades 9-12. Both programs, spanning a condensed duration of four weeks, empower students to accelerate their learning within a focused framework.
